El artículo indefinido (singular) se usa:

1. Cuando la identidad de un sustantivo no es conocida o no es importante
2. Para mostrar que algo es parte de un grupo
3. Para decir la profesión de alguien

There's a red bump where a mosquito bit me.

I'm an American citizen.

He's a doctor. She's an actress.

Singular y Plural

Singular

- Usa "**a**" enfrente de un sustantivo singular.
- Usa "**an**" cuando la próxima palabra empieza con una vocal o una "h" muda.

You're a nurse.

You're an amazing nurse.

I wrote this book in an hour.

Plural

- Usamos "**some**" enfrente de un sustantivo plural o no contable.
- "Some" se reemplaza por "**any**" en la forma negativa e interrogativa.

There is some food left. I'm eating some cookies.

There **isn't** any food left.

Do you want any cookies?
