Reglas Generales

- Toda oración completa requiere un sujeto escrito. El sujeto puede ser:
 - Un pronombre de sujeto
 - Un nombre específico (persona/ cosa)
- Se puede usar un pronombre de 3ª persona cuándo ya es claro de quien hablas (la persona/ grupo ya se ha mencionado).
- El pronombre "I" siempre tiene mayúscula. Los otros pronombres tienen mayúscula si empiezan una oración nueva.
- "It" es un pronombre neutro que se usa para:
 - Ideas/ conceptos/ situaciones generales
 - Objetos y otras cosas no vivas
 - Un animal de género no especificado

I am outside. You are inside.

Kelly is from Brazil. Brazil is a big country.

*I saw **Bobby** today. He is very nice.*

***My parents** are 40. They are still young.*

He is American, she is Chilean, and I am French.
