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Cómo formar

Sujeto + did not + base verbal

(didn't)

To talk	To watch	To want
I did not talk	I did not watch	I did not want
you did not talk	you did not watch	you did not want
(s)he did not talk	(s)he did not watch	(s)he did not want

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Reglas Generales

1. Para hacer la forma negativa, añade "did not" entre el sujeto y la base verbal.
 - We did not like soccer. (*Nos gustaba el béisbol. No nos gustaba el fútbol.*)
 - Tom didn't understand the joke so he didn't laugh. (*Tom no entendió el chiste, así que no se rió.*)

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Reglas Generales

2. Fijate que la base verbal en todas las personas es siempre igual.
 - Tara didn't go. You didn't go, either. (*Tara no fue. Tú tampoco fuiste.*)
 - He didn't work on Sunday. I didn't work on Friday. (*Él no trabajó el domingo. Yo no trabajé el viernes.*)

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Reglas Generales

3. "Did not" se acorta a "didn't." Esta forma es mas común en el habla cotidiana.
 - I did not have fun. → I didn't have fun. (*No me divertí.*)
 - He did not thank me. → He didn't thank me. (*No me dio las gracias.*)
